

Background

Currently, 26 states offer some form of teacher loan forgiveness. Most states pay for these programs through trusts or specific funds that are filled through appropriations by the state legislature, or are capped to amounts set within state statute. Alternatively, the federal government does allow for the use of ESSER and GEER funds to be spent on such programs as well.
